## Description

After showing sample videos of students of different English proficiencies performing language tasks, the presenter will explain how to share them for educational purposes within a secure LMS and on Youtube. She'll demonstrate how to create a channel, upload videos, enter appropriate information, and make privacy and other setting choices.

## Equipment

Flip camera, smart phone, laptop or desktop camera, webcam, DSLR camera. Be sure to record landscape (horizontal), not portrait (vertical). Headset.

## Recording operator options

Teacher records students. Students record each other in pairs and small groups. Students record themselves (or get friends outside of class).

## Some considerations

Adults only, with consent, if public. No children. Lighting: students are ideally front-lit, not back-lit. Microphone placement: near students unless wired remotely. Voice projection: students should try to speak louder than ambient noise.

## Sharing videos with students

Give/send file to individuals.

Upload to course LMS (Learning Management System).

Upload to Youtube or other video service.

Embed video in a blog.

Play video in class
